How do I become a judge?

Five easy steps!

- 1) Contact Alison Clausen, the West Virginia State Judging Director (SJD). Also check out the resources listed below to read up on becoming a judge.
- 2) Purchase the materials needed to study from USA Gymnastics. The SJD will help you determine what materials you may need.
- 3) Attend a local, regional, or national Congress or clinic if one is available (not required, but highly recommended)
- 4) Contact local gyms to observe routines (not required, but recommended)
- 5) Take and pass the test. A master testing schedule is available on the USA Gymnastics website. The SJD can also work with you to schedule an exam.
